The New York State Board of Law Examiners

Operating under the auspices of the New York State Court of Appeals, the New York State Board of Law Examiners is responsible for administering the bar examination to candidates seeking admission to practice law in the State of New York.

The Board has been in existence for over a hundred years, having been created by the New York State Legislature in 1894. Its five members are practicing attorneys appointed by the Court of Appeals. The Board maintains a business office in Albany, New York with a full-time staff that oversees the bar examination.



The bar examination is administered twice per year, on the last Tuesday and Wednesday of February and

July. Approximately 15,000 candidates take the bar examination annually.

Important Notice(s) for February Bar Exam Applicants:

As part of the application process, the Board now requires all applicants to provide their 9-digit LSAC (Law School Admission Council) number when completing an online application to sit for the bar examination.

The LSAC number is expected to eventually become the new unique identifier in place of the SSN when applying to take the bar examination.

Applicants can look up their LSAC number at <http://lsaclookup.lsac.org/lookup.aspx> or if you do not currently have an LSAC number, you may obtain one by creating an account at <https://os.lsac.org/Release/Logon/Access.aspx>.

The Legislature has amended Judiciary Law Section 465 which sets the application fee for the New York bar examination.

The bar examination fee schedule beginning with the February 2011 bar exam will be as follows:

Examination Fee (by method of qualifying – see Judiciary Law section 465)




Section 520.3 (ABA approved law schools).....	\$250
Section 520.4 (law office study).....	\$250
Section 520.5 (unapproved law schools).....	\$250
Section 520.6 (study of law in foreign country).....	\$750

Transfer of a prior MBE score:

The Board has amended Rule 6000.6(g) concerning the transfer of MBE scores to New York from another jurisdiction. Beginning with the February 2011 bar examination, the Board will no longer accept the transfer of MBE scores earned from a prior administration of the MBE in another jurisdiction. The Board will continue to allow the transfer of concurrent MBE scores earned in another jurisdiction.
